The National Animal Welfare Trust (NAWT) is one of the UK's largest animal welfare charities. Every year the Trust finds new homes for hundreds of unwanted animals including dogs, cats, rabbits and guinea pigs. As well as domestic pets, NAWT's four re-homing centres care for a surprisingly wide range of animals from pigs to ponies and alpacas!

The Trust was established in 1971 and operates four re-homing centres across the south of England. It is our vision that in the future no animal will be refused help and, on entering our care, every animal is found a suitable and loving home.

All of our centres retain their own unique character and environment with each enjoying loyal support from their local communities.

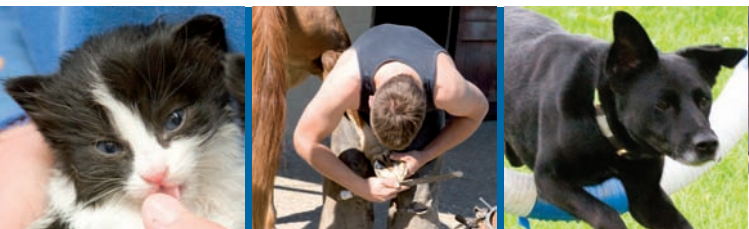




Animal Welfare

On any one day the Trust cares for over 500 animals and NAWT's staff work hard to ensure that animals coming into the Trust's centres are given the very best of care. The veterinary team are on hand to support every aspect of the animals' welfare from routine vaccinations and neutering to more complex operations. The Trust also provides a rehabilitation program for problem animals, together with a robust re-homing process which ensures each animal is found the right home for its needs. NAWT continues to offer advice and guidance where needed to new owners once the animal is homed.

Occasionally we receive older animals for which finding new homes can be challenging as well as dogs that find it hard to cope in one of our busier kennel environments. In these cases, we provide a uniquely tranquil alternative at our Berkshire centre, Trindledown Farm. Accommodation with TVs, radios and comfy sofas make Trindledown a peaceful haven for our older or more stressed residents!





Raising Funds

Across the Trust a calendar of open days, dog agility displays and fundraising events raise funds to support our work. NAWT warmly welcomes volunteer help from both the public and corporate communities alike. Members of our hard working supporter branches are always looking for new volunteers. 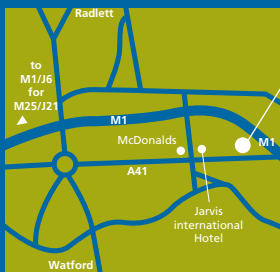
