Building on a great legacy...

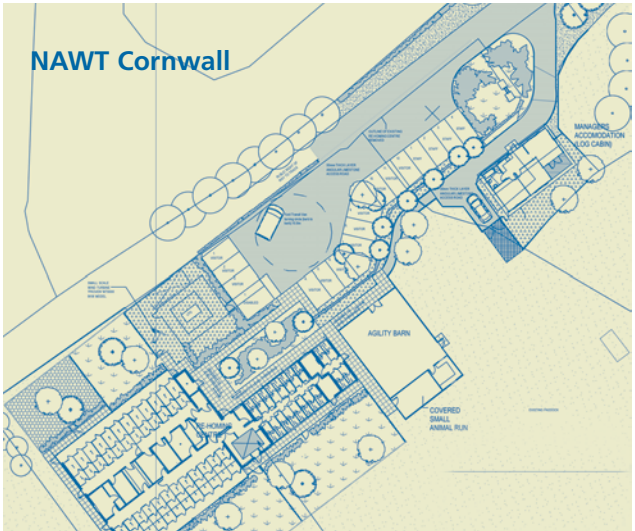
The centre builds on the work of Molly Wyatt, who dedicated herself to helping stray dogs, before she passed away in 1996. From our origins in local canine rescue, we are now looking to the future. NAWT Cornwall is developing a purpose-built, permanent facility to enhance our work. We will be able to help many more cats and dogs – and in the longer term, aim to look after guinea pigs and rabbits. As one of the few organisations in Cornwall taking in neglected and unwanted animals, our new centre will significantly boost Cornish animal welfare.

Our shop

Our shop in nearby Falmouth provides an extra source of support with stocks of new NAWT goods, as well as donated clothing, CDs, toys and bric-a-brac including jewellery and small items of furniture.



Plans for a new centre unveiled

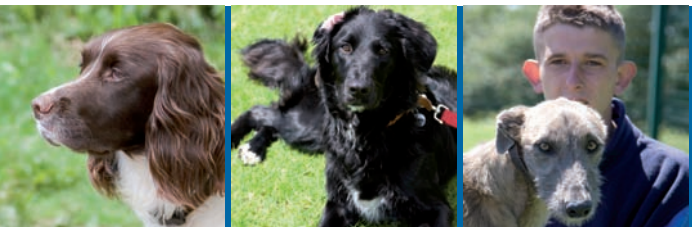


NAWT's new centre in Hayle will house significantly more homeless animals than we can currently accommodate.

It will consist of 24 dog units and 20 cat pens as well as a small animal section. The new complex will also provide a treatment room, interview rooms for those wishing to adopt an animal, staff accommodation, laundry, kitchens and offices.

A key feature of this new project will be the availability of basic in-house veterinary facilities for the animals in our care. Routine treatments will include health checks, blood sampling and treatment for minor illnesses and injuries.
